REVIEW OF REPORTING REQUIREMENTS (DECISION 16.45)

1. This document has been prepared by the Chair of the Standing Committee Working Group on Special Reporting Requirements, in consultation with the interim Chairs of the Animals and Plants Committees and the Secretariat. It is being submitted by the interim Chairs of the Animals and Plants Committees.

Background

- 2. The Standing Committee Working Group on Special Reporting Requirements have been undertaking a review of the reporting requirements that have been agreed by CITES Parties over the years. The Working Group made a recommendation at the 62nd meeting of the Standing Committee (SC62, Geneva, July 2012) in paragraph 40 of document SC62 Doc 24.2 to involve the Animals and Plants Committees in assessing which of these reporting requirements are still current and valid, or whether they are outdated or otherwise unnecessary and can be considered for deletion. At its 16th meeting (CoP16, Bangkok, 2013), the Conference of the Parties adopted Decision 16.45 on Review of Reporting Requirements to implement that recommendation.
- 3. More detail on the review of reporting requirements, including the mandate for the Animals and Plants Committee contained in Decision 16.45, is provided in document AC27/PC21 Doc.11. Paragraph 9 of document AC27/PC21 Doc.11 states:

It is recommended that the Animals and Plants Committees review each of the reporting requirements identified in Annex 1 as being relevant to them (and others if they consider they are also relevant to the Animals or Plants Committees' remits) and advise in the last column of Annex 1 whether the requirement is:

- a) still current and valid, or;
- b) outdated or otherwise unnecessary, and therefore no longer required.
- 4. The interim Chairs of the Animals and Plants Committees considered that it would be useful for a proposal to be provided for each of the requirements to be reviewed by the Animals and Plants Committees as a

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starting point for the Committees' discussions and to facilitate an efficient review. That is the purpose of this information document; Annex 1 to this document contains a draft recommendation for each requirement.

- 5. Annex 1 to this document is a subset of the requirements presented in Annex 1 of Document AC27/PC20 Doc.11, focussing on the requirements for which Animals or Plants Committee input is requested. It provides (in its last column):
 - A recommendation whether each requirement should be maintained or deleted (bold text);
 - A few suggested changes to the Committee(s) being requested to review particular reporting requirements (plain text preceded by 'Note from WG SRR chair');
 - Explanatory points (plain text); and
 - A proposal for the advice required from Animals and Plants Committees to fulfil the mandate in Decision 16.45 (italic text).

Reporting Requirements, and whether they should be reviewed by Standing, Animals, or Plants Committee(s).

Row Key is the number of the reporting requirement in the spreadsheet developed by the Working Group on Special Reporting Requirements, and is included to allow cross reference with the spreadsheet, which is the master version of this information. If any reader wishes to have access to the actual spreadsheet they are recommended to contact the Chair of the Working Group via the Secretariat.

SC = Standing Committee, AC = Animals Committee, PC = Plants Committee. A '1' in any of these columns indicates that the relevant committee should review the requirement and provide comment in the last column of the table on whether it is (a) still current and valid or (b) outdated or otherwise unnecessary, and therefore no longer required (see paragraph 9 of document AC27/PC21 Doc.11).
