ANNOTATION TO CISTANCHE DESERTICOLA

- 1. At its 11th meeting, the Conference of the Parties approved a proposal to include *Cistanche deserticola* in Appendix II with the annotation "designates whole and sliced roots and parts of roots, excluding manufactured parts or derivatives such as powders, pills, extracts, tonics teas and confectionery".
- 2. It was not noted during the meeting, or immediately afterwards, that this annotation was incorrect because *Cistanche deserticola* is a parasite and does not have roots!
- 3. The parts that are traded are dried or fresh undeveloped inflorescences, which are harvested when still subterranean, hence the reference to 'roots'.
- 4. It is clear that the intention of the proponent was that only the trade in these inflorescences should be regulated and that all manufactured products should be exempt from CITES controls.
- 5. The Secretariat intends to prepare a Notification to the Parties on the subject, and will cooperate with China in preparing an amendment proposal to correct the current annotation.
