## Follow-up of CoP12 Decisions

GUAIACUM SPP. [DECISION 11.114 (REV. COP12)]: PROGRESS REPORT

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. At its 12th meeting (Santiago, 2002) the Conference of the Parties adopted a proposal to include *Guaiacum* spp. in Appendix II of the Convention and Decision 11.114 (Rev. CoP12) on *Guaiacum* species as follows:

The Plants Committee shall assess the status of Guaiacum species in the wild, the status in trade and threats to the species.

- 3. At the 13th meeting of the Plants Committee (PC13, Geneva, August, 2003), the observer from Mexico summarized the progress of current research on the population status and management of *Guaiacum sanctum* in Mexico. The Plants Committee encouraged Mexico to take this work further.
- 4. Following PC13 the Secretariat contracted the *Comisión Nacional para el Conocimiento y Uso de la Biodiversidad* (CONABIO) which is the Scientific Authority of Mexico to study the distribution, abundance, and population dynamics of *Guaiacum sanctum* (and sympatric populations of *G. coulteri* if identified) in Mexico in order to determine the conservation status and availability of the species. The study should provide a basis for determining the viability of exploiting wild populations of *Guaiacum sanctum* in a sustainable manner in compliance with Article IV of the Convention. The study will be completed in November 2005.
- 5. The Plants Committee may wish to review progress on this work as outlined in information document PC14 Inf. 1 (English only) and to consider whether the study can be used as a model for work in other countries.
