FOURTH MEETING OF THE MAHOGANY WORKING GROUP AND FIRST LATIN AMERICAN WORKSHOP ON THE JOINT CITES-ITTO PROJECT: ENSURING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN CITES-LISTED TIMBER SPECIES IS CONSISTENT WITH THEIR SUSTAINABLE MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION

OVERVIEW OF THE MEETING

The workshop was held in Cancun, in the state of Quintana Roo, Mexico, November 13 - 15, 2008.

The event was carried out according to the planned agenda (Annex 1). The opening remarks were delivered by Mr. José G. Roque Alamina (Director of the Forestry Institute of the Government of the state of Quintana Roo). The following officials attended the opening ceremony: Ms. Milena Sosa Schmidt (Scientific Officer Plants-CITES), Dr. Steve Johnson (Associate Director of the ITTO), Dr. Francisco García García (Director General of Forestry Management and Soils-SEMARNAT and Chairman of the Mahogany Working Group-MWG), Mr. Ramón Eduardo Rosado Flores (Federal Delegate of SEMARNAT in Quintana Roo).

Attendance consisted of 37 participants representing 6 countries of the area of distribution (Belize, Brazil, Guatemala, Mexico, Nicaragua, Peru), one representative of the CITES Secretariat, The Chair of the Plants Committee of CITES, two representatives from the Central America, South America and Caribbean Region of the CITES Plants Committee, two representatives from the United States, one representative of the International Tropical Timber Institute and one representative of the European Economic Community (Annex 2).

In connection with the Joint CITES-ITTO Project: Ensuring International Trade in CITES-listed Timber Species is consistent with their Sustainable Management and Conservation, a general overview of its implementation in Latin America, Asia and Africa was presented, as were the proposed supported projects in Latin America (Bolivia, Brazil and Peru).

In regard to Mahogany, a presentation was made on the guidelines derived from the International Workshop of Experts on Non-detriment Findings on Mahogany (Cancun, April 2007), as well as a summary of the objectives of the Working Group on Timber Species of the International Workshop of Experts on Non-detriment Findings on Mahogany (Cancun, April 2007) and the current status of significant trade for Mahogany.

Later, a progress report was delivered on the Plan of Action for *Cedrela odorata*, and on the subject of problems associated with specific populations of the timber species listed in Appendix III.

Last, based on the Action Plan for bigleaf mahogany, as well as on the Recommendations in the Report of the Bigleaf Mahogany Working Group, (Lima, Peru. June 29 – July 01, 2006. Document PC16 Doc. 19.1.1), a draft regional strategy was prepared (PC 18 Doc. 13.1.2 Annex 1).
