## Regulation of trade

- a) review and, if appropriate, revise the draft guidance in the Annex to the addendum to document PC25 Doc. 22;
- b) agree on the best way to publish a consolidated version of the guidance on terms relating to 'artificially propagated', including consider incorporating it in a new edition of the publication *A Guide to the application of CITES source codes*;
- c) consider the draft decisions in paragraph 5 of this addendum; and
- d) report its recommendations to the Committee.

- b) consider conservation benefits to wild populations and any adverse effects on the conservation of Appendix-I species that have been subject to the implementation of paragraph 4;

- c) on the basis of the above, consider the pertinence of changing paragraph 4 of Resolution Conf. 11.11 (Rev. CoP18) and draft possible editorial amendments to improve its clarity;

- b) discuss key gaps in knowledge and information documents PC25 Inf. 7 and PC25 Inf. 18, and propose recommendations to address the sustainable use and conservation of these species, and consider whether any Boswellia species could meet the criteria for listing in the Appendices;
- c) consider the pertinence of extending or revising Decisions 18.205 to 18.208; and
- d) report its recommendations to the Committee.

- c) explore the pertinence of developing draft decisions that could be put forward by the Secretariat for consideration of the CoP;
- d) provide any additional recommendation, for the Secretariat to consider should it bring forward a draft resolution on CITES and forests.
