SUBSTANTIVE REVIEW OF RESOLUTIONS

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. In the context of its continuing review of Resolutions, the Secretariat intends to prepare proposals for revision of a number of Resolutions, for consideration at the 16th meeting of the Conference of the Parties. These proposals arise from: the normal work of the Secretariat, in the course of which it becomes aware of a variety of problems of interpretation or implementation of the Resolutions; the Secretariat's regular review of Resolutions with a view to proposing consolidations; the linguistic review that is taking place in fulfilment of Decision 14.19; and correspondence from Parties and organizations suggesting the need for corrections.
- 3. In consequence, the Secretariat will be reviewing the Resolutions listed in the table below, and is likely to prepare proposals to amend them, for the reason indicated. The possible need for further substantive amendments may arise from the linguistic review being conducted by the Working Group on the Review of Resolutions.

During the third revision (at CoP14, the Hague, 2007), the Conference of the Parties removed the statement that "the Animals Committee shall also deal with issues related to the transport of live animals". This was not done in the French version.
	_	To make a correction, in the Spanish version only. Also during the third revision, in Annex 2, under the second 'DETERMINES', paragraph a), the Conference of the Parties added a phrase to indicate that the payment of travel expenses of committee members did not apply to representatives of developed countries. This was omitted in the Spanish version.
11.3 (Rev. CoP15) Compliance and enforcement	-	To remove the reference to the Secretariat's "report on alleged infractions" (sic), which is no longer produced.
11.17 (Rev. CoP14) National reports	-	To insert a deadline for the submission of annual reports, as is done for submission of biennial reports. For the former, there is only a decision on action to be taken if an annual report is not received by 31 October of "the year following the year for which the report was due".

The draft of the Resolution [in document CoP15 Doc. 6.5 (Rev. 1), Annex 6] contained the following recommendation, which was deleted from subsequent versions in the English, but this was not done in the preparation of the French and Spanish: <i>INVITES all Parties to support, through their</i> <i>representatives in UNEP, UNDP and the World Bank,</i> <i>the requests for additional funding of CITES-related</i>
