	The Committee <u>noted</u> document SC62 Doc. 34 and <u>recommended</u> that the United States of America take into account the suggestions of several Parties and their offers to cooperate on the preparation of a document for CoP16.

	The Committee <u>noted</u> document SC62 Doc. 43 and <u>agreed</u> that the Secretariat would issue a Notification to Parties reminding them of their reporting obligations, to enable a full assessment at CoP16. That Notification should stress that information is required for all Asian big cats. It would also stress the need for information relating to compliance with Decision 14.69, by requesting:
