RHINO CONSERVATION IN ZIMBABWE: 2012 - 2013

1.0 RHINO AREAS AND THEIR SIZES IN ZIMBABWE AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2013

A total area of 7 802 km² (3 023 km² = 39% is State land and 4 779 km² = 61% is private land) is supports black rhinos and of 19 260 km² (15 124 km² = 80% is state land and 4 136 km² = 20% is private land) supports white rhinos. State land and private land that are supporting rhinos are shown in Table 1.

2.0 CURRENT STATUS OF RHINO POPULATIONS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2013.

There were 753 rhinos (457 black and 296 white rhinos) in Zimbabwe as at 31 December 2013 (Table 1). 90% (410) of the black rhinos and 81% (240) of the white rhinos were on private land. Black rhino subpopulations that were over 100 individuals are found in Malilangwe, Save Valley Conservancy and Bubye Valley Conservancy and of white rhinos were in Malilangwe only.

3.0 CHANGES IN RHINO POPULATIONS






Figure 1: Trends in black and white rhino numbers in Zimbabwe from 2000 to 2013.

Since 2000 black rhinos declined while white rhinos increased in numbers (Figure 1) both national populations are recovering. Changes in rhino national and subpopulations between 2012 and 2013 are given in Table 1. The national black rhino population increased by 7% and white increased by 4% between 2012 and 2013.

On Stateland, black rhinos declined by 4.4% and white rhinos increased by 5% between 2012 and 2013. All black and white rhino sub populations on stateland did not change in numbers between 2012 and 2013, except an increase in Sinamatella and a decline in Matopos.

On private land, black rhinos increased by about 8% and white rhinos by 6.7% between 2012 and 2013. Both black and white rhino subpopulations in Malilangwe, Save Valley Conservancy and Bubye Valley Conservancy increased, while black rhino subpopulations in the Midlands Black rhino Conservancy, Stanley and Livingstone and Imire did not change, white rhino subpopulations in Imire did not change and white rhinos in Thetford and Eldorado declined between 2012 and 2013.

4.0 ILLEGAL KILLING OF RHINOS IN 2013




Figure 2: Trends in rhino poaching in Zimbabwe from 2000 to 2013.

A total of 21 rhinos (7 black and 14 white) died between January and December 2013. Out of these mortalities, 16 (6 black and 10 white) were poached and the remainder (5) died due to other factors. (Tables 2, 3 and 4). There was a drop in poaching from a total of 52 rhinos in 2010, 38 in 2011, 22 in 2012 to 16 in 2013 (Figure 2).

5.0 AMENDMENT OF SECTION 128 OF CAP. 20:14

The Parks and Wild Life Act [Chapter 20:14] is amended by the repeal of section 128 and substitution of the following- "128 Special penalty for certain offences"

- (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, any person who is guilty of an offence under this Act involving;
- (a) The unlawful killing or hunting of rhinoceros, or any other specially protected animal specified by the Minister by statutory instrument; or
- (b) The unlawful possession of, or trading in, ivory or any trophy of rhinoceros or any other specially protected animal that may be specified by the Minister by statutory instrument;

Shall be liable-

- (i) On a first conviction, to imprisonment for a period of nor less than nine years;
- (ii) On a second or subsequent conviction, to imprisonment for a period of not less than eleven years.

6.0 COMPENSATION VALUES

Persons convicted in rhino poaching cases are ordered to pay compensation for illegal killing of the rhino. Compensation value for rhino is USD120 000.00 per animal as gazette in Statutory Instrument 56 of 2012.

7.0 PERMITS

There is no legal trade in rhinos and rhino products.

8.0 WORKSHOPS AND COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Legal Awareness campaigns are regularly carried out in the communities living adjacent to rhino holding properties. A number of stakeholder workshops that address challenges in the investigations and docket compilation by case officers are always being conducted. Organizations such as the Low-Veld Rhino trust have been active in Malilangwe, Save Valley and Bubye Valley Conservancies. Members of the judiciary also hold seminars that target wildlife related cases and sentencing provisions for various offences.

9.0 RHINO HORN STOCKPILE

The current rhino stockpile is at 4 961.31kgs. The horns are kept at Central Stores in a vault and guarded 24 hours in a day.

9.1 RHINO CRIME ANALYSIS FOR 2012 AND 2013

All rhino poaching incidents are reported to the responsible authorities. Of all the reported cases, 18 resulted in the arrest of the alleged offenders who were brought before the courts.

The majority of the reported incidents were of direct poaching by armed gangs and a few involved illegal possession of rhino horns and fire arms. A total of 18 Zimbabwean nationals and 4 Zambian nationals were arrested. A total of 10 firearms, 253 rounds of ammunition and 15 rhino horns were also recovered.

Those convicted received jail terms ranging from eight (8) years in prison to a maximum of eighteen (18) years in prison. A total of 9 cases are at various stages of investigations and some are still pending at our courts around the country.
