DRAFT RESOLUTIONS FROM ZAMBIA

- After the preparation of document Doc. 5.23, the Republic of Zambia sent to the Secretariat two draft resolutions (Annexes 1 and 2)* on trade in leopard skins.
- 2. These two drafts are similar to those submitted by Zimbabwe (Doc. 5.23 Annexes 2 and 3) and Zambia is seeking the approval of either of them.
- 3. The first draft seeks a mechanism similar to that suggested by the Seminar on CITES Implementation in Africa (Brussels, 1984) on the ivory trade. The second simply seeks an increment of the quota set forth for Zambia in Resolution Conf. 4.13.
- 4. In its 1983 Annual Report, Zambia indicates the export of a total of 112 leopard skins.
