2. Biological Data

- 21. Distribution: The American Continent. Most species are confined to the tropical regions of South America. Some species occur in the subtropical and the temperate regions of North and South America, including the Caribbean. Many species are highly specialized, and occupy therefore only limited areas.
- 22. Population: Population data are few. Some of the species have a wide distribution and a safe population, other species are scarce, some only known from one locality. Destruction and loss of habitat affect a large number of species and populations. Capture of hummingbirds for commercial purposes, especially considering the methods used, forms a threat to vulnerable populations.
- 23. Habitat: Hummingbirds occur in a variety of habitats, from dense primary rainforests to urban regions. A number of species has shown to be able to adapt to man made changes, such as banana plantations, many other species, however, suffer from loss of suitable habitat and are not able to occupy other habitats.

34. Potential Trade Threats: There exists an increasing trend in Western Europe and in the USA (Clear, 1986) towards keeping hummingbirds. Survival rates during the capture of specimens and during transport are probably low.
