- 23. <u>Habitat</u>: Standing or slow-moving shallow water, on a muddy substrate with an abundance of grass or moss. Habitat destruction or modification is a major threat.

Legislative protection in nearly all US states where it occurs.

CITES history: Listed at Washington, D.C., 1973, at the request of the United States of America giving habitat destruction and collection for pet trade as reason for decline.
