Superficially similar to members of the genus $\underline{\text{Delma}}$ but is easily identified and separated from all other $\underline{\text{Delma}}$ $\underline{\text{spp.}}$ by the presence of four preanal pores.

6. Comments from Countries of Origin

P. orientalis is endemic to Australia.

7. Additional Remarks

This species is relatively widespread and common where it occurs. There is no evidence of any trade.
