2. Biological Data

- 21. <u>Distribution</u>: Restricted to the tops of Volcanos Tacaná,
 Tajumulco and Santa María. Altitude above 2,000m. It is likely
 that the population of Volcano Santa María has already been
 destroyed by the volcanic activity.
- 22. <u>Population</u>: Extremely rare plant whose existence is endangered by habitat destruction through volcanic eruptions, cutting of forests and commercial collection. Very small, probably less than 300 wild plants.
- 23. <u>Habitat:</u> Wet oak and pine forests, lithophytic on rocks in precipice. Rarely epiphytic.

3. Trade Data

- 31. National Utilization: Ornamental plant.
- 32. Legal International Trade: None.
- 33. Illegal Trade: Collection and sale to traders of neighbouring countries. From there, export to the United States of America and Europe.

34. <u>Potential Trade Threats:</u> Very attractive species of commerical value abroad. Threatened through external demand and lack of national recovery programme.

4. Protection Status

41. National:

- a) In theory, law requires licences for cutting trees in forests. Most of the population is on private land.
- 42. International: Listed in CITES Appendix II.

43. Additional Protection Needs:

- a) Control export of wild plants to Belize, Mexico, El Salvador and Honduras.
- b) Stimulate seed production and cultivation of plants in nursery for commercial sale.

5. Information on Similar Species

Lemboglossum bictoniense (Lindl.) Halbinger. Similar plant, common in cypress, pine and oak forests between 1,700 and 3,200m altitude. The labellum of L. uroskinneri is round and very broad, the labellum of L. bictoniense is in the form of a heart and pointed.
