- 2. Biological Data
 - 21. Distribution: Brazil. Rio de Janeiro, summit of the Organ Mountains at 2088 m elevation (Hooker, 1842). Edge of Campos do Antas, ca 2140 m, Organ Mountains east of Rio de Janeiro [herbarium specimens, US (Smithsonian Institution)]. Environs of Rio de Janeiro and of Ouro Prêto (herbarium specimen, Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew).
 - 22. <u>Population</u>: Growing in large patches (Hooker, 1842). It is included in the list of threatened species of Carvalho (1968).
 - 23. <u>Habitat</u>: Summit of mountains at elevations over 2000 m in moist, exposed places (Hooker, 1842).
- 3. Trade Data
 - 31. National Utilization: Not known.
 - 32. <u>Legal International Trade</u>: No evidence. The Brazilian Div. de Proteção à Natureza held no commercial data on this species by 1980.
 - 33. Illegal Trade: Not known.
 - 34. Potential Trade Threats: This species appears to have no international trade threats. Accessibility to the species, which was somewhat remote, has diminished with restoration of a

national park to a more natural state [Dr. J. Kirkbride, Jr. (U.S. Dept. Agriculture, Agricultural Research Service), who has field knowledge of the species, pers. comm. to B. MacBryde, 13/05/89]. (Resolution Conf. 4.26 encourages completion of the 10-year review.)

- 4. Protection Status
 - 41. <u>National</u>: The species is protected by Brazilian law, allowing only scientific collection under licence. Portaria No. 303 implements Lei No. 5197, regulating transport, trade, and export (Davis et al., 1986; Fuller and Swift, 1984).
 - 42. International: Unknown. Resolution Conf. 2.19 does not appear to support the CITES listing of this species, in view of the lack of trade interest in it.
 - 43. Additional Protection Needs: The species is not one of the plants Brazil included in the Annex to the Convention on Nature Protection and Wildlife Preservation in the Western Hemisphere [OEA/Ser.A/74a (SEPF); cf. Prance and Elias, 1977].

Specimens collected by Gardner were grown in Kew and Glasgow Botanic Gardens (Hooker, 1842); recorded in cultivation in the Gardeners Chronicle of 1890. Bailey (1976) does not include <u>Prepusa</u> among the genera of Gentianaceae now in cultivation (at <u>least in U.S.A.</u>).

5. Information on Similar Species

Two other species of <u>Prepusa</u> are known from the same area (in the state of Rio de Janeiro): <u>P. connata</u> Gardner and <u>P. montana</u> Mart. (Hooker, 1842). There are five species in Prepusa.
