CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA

Thirteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties Bangkok (Thailand), 2-14 October 2004

DRAFT DECISIONS OF THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES.

The following draft decisions have been prepared by a working group on sharks chaired by New Zealand and established by Committee I, following discussions of agenda item 35.

Directed to the Animals Committee

- 13.xx The Animals Committee, taking account of FAO's work on the conservation and management of sharks and on CITES implementation issues relating to listed marine species, shall:
 - a) review implementation issues related to sharks listed on CITES Appendices with a view *inter alia* to sharing experiences that may have arisen and solutions that may have been found;
 - b) identify specific cases where trade is having an adverse impact on sharks, and in particular those key shark species threatened in this way;
 - c) prepare a report on trade related measures adopted and implemented by Parties which are aimed at improving the conservation status of sharks; and
 - d) report back on the above to the 14th meeting of the Conference of Parties.

Directed to Parties

13.xx Parties:

- a) shall request through their delegations to FAO COFI 26 that FAO consider convening a workshop or consultation on the conservation and management of sharks, in time for output to be considered at CoP 14, *inter alia* to:
 - i) consider and review progress with the implementation of the IPOA-Sharks;
 - ii) [assess the effectiveness and efficiency of current conservation and management measures for sharks and identify any improvements needed;]
- b) are encouraged to improve their data collection and reporting to FAO of catches, landings and trade of sharks, at the species level where possible, recognising that *inter alia* this may be a first step towards the development and implementation of Shark Assessment Reports and National Plans of Action:
- c) that require assistance to build capacity to manage their shark fisheries are encouraged to seek such assistance from FAO or other appropriate organisations;
- d) shall take note of the species-specific recommendations in CoP13 Doc.35 Annex 2 with a view to ensuring that international trade is not detrimental to the status of these species; and
- e) [are encouraged to consider stricter domestic measures for CITES listed sharks, where they deem it necessary].
