Tagging of markhor (Capra falconeri) trophies

- 1. Resolution Conf. 10.15 (Rev. CoP12) recommends that each markhor hunting trophy exported from Pakistan have a self-locking tag indicating *inter alia* the calendar year to which the quota applies.
- 2. The CITES Management Authority of Pakistan has found that, owing to a quota limited to 12 trophies a year, it is not economically viable or practical to have tags manufactured that include the quota year figures.
- 3. Pakistan has, therefore, asked the Secretariat to advise the Parties that it will use previously-acquired tags for exports of markhor hunting trophies, which will bear the following information only: the letters 'CITESPKFAL', followed by a 7-digit unique and sequential number for each tag. For example, 'CITESPKFAL0000019'. The export permit for each shipment will clearly state the quota year to which the trophy relates.
- 4. Importing countries are encouraged to contact the CITES Management Authority of Pakistan should they have any reason to question the authenticity or validity of a markhor hunting trophy tag.
