Executive Order -- Combating Wildlife Trafficking

EXECUTIVE ORDER

COMBATING WILDLIFE TRAFFICKING

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, and in order to address the significant effects of wildlife trafficking on the national interests of the United States, I hereby order as follows:

Presidential Executive Order on Enforcing Federal Law with Respect to Transnational Criminal Organizations and Preventing International Trafficking

Sec. 2. Policy. It shall be the policy of the executive branch to:

- (a) strengthen enforcement of Federal law in order to thwart transnational criminal organizations and subsidiary organizations, including criminal gangs, cartels, racketeering organizations, and other groups engaged in illicit activities that present a threat to public safety and national security and that are related to, for example:
 - the illegal smaggling and trafficking of humans, drugs or other substances, wildlife, and weapons;
 - (ii) corruption, cybercrime, fraud, financial crimes, and intellectual-






ATTACHÉ PROGRAM MODEL

WILDLIFE LAW ENFORCEMENT ATTACHÉS



ROLE OF THE USFWS SPECIAL AGENT ATTACHÉS

- Coordinate transnational investigations and information and Intel sharing
- Support FWS OLE investigations within area of responsibility
- Assist in leveraging US government assets for use in counter wildlife trafficking (CWT) efforts
- Support host government's and regional CWT investigations
- Support regional capacity building

ATTACHÉ ROLE WITHIN THE U.S. EMBASSY

- Attaché serves under:
 - Chief of Mission Authority
 - Deputy Chief of Mission Providing regular updates on all activities
 - Senior Staff and member of the Country Team
 - Coordinates with other U.S. Government agencies in furtherance of mission
