## New Zealand's stricter domestic measures for trade in personal and household effects

- 1. This Notification is being published at the request of New Zealand.
- 2. New Zealand wishes to remind CITES Parties that it implements stricter domestic measures governing the import of personal and household effects.
- New Zealand would like to ask for the help of CITES Parties to implement these stricter domestic measures governing the import of personal and household effects. We respectfully request that CITES Parties issue CITES permits for the export and re-export to New Zealand of CITES specimens in accordance with New Zealand's stricter measures.
- 4. Under these provisions, import into New Zealand of personal and household effects of Appendix I and II species requires an export permit, re-export certificate, pre-Convention certificate, or other certificate of exemption issued by an appropriate Management Authority.
- 5. The exception to this provision is where the specimen was acquired by the owner within New Zealand.
- 6. Personal and household effects of Appendix III species imported for non-commercial reasons do not require an export permit, re-export certificate or certificate or origin, regardless of country of acquisition.
