CHINA

Change to China's CITES permits and certificates

- 1. This Notification is being published at the request of China.
- China wishes to inform CITES Parties that starting from 1 July 2019 new versions of the permits and certificates will be used by CITES Management Authority of China. Meanwhile, the old versions remain valid until 1 January 2020.
 - a) Categories there are eight forms for the new permits and certificates:
 - 1) Import permit,
 - 2) Export permit,
 - 3) Re-export certificate,
 - 4) introduction from the sea certificate,
 - 5) Certificate for Multiple cross-border transfer of musical instruments which contain restricted fauna and flora parts,
 - 6) Travelling exhibition of specimens certificate,
 - 7) Multiple cross-border transfer of privately-owned live animals (certificate of ownership);
 - 8) Erhu carried in as hand luggage by individuals abroad (personnel and household goods certificate).
 - b) Certificate types currently, both electronic and paper certificates will be used at the same time, except for the following two cases where only electronic certificates can be issued:
 - i) specimens of species included in Appendix I which do not meet the exemption conditions;
 - ii) introduction from the sea.
 - c) Security measures for permits and certificates the new document has a number of anti-counterfeiting measures, such as an almost invisible watermark on the lower left comer of the certificates.
 - d) Certificate query scan the two-dimensional barcode of the certificates or login https://cites.singlewindow.cn/certver/cites, then input the number of the permit or certificate, security number and serial number.
