Stricter domestic measures: New policy on ivory trade

- 1. The present Notification to the Parties is published at the request of Israel.
- 2. A new policy on trade in ivory of elephants and mammoths is being instituted in Israel, effective from 1 January 2021.
- 3. *International trade*: This new policy generally does not allow any international trade in ivory except for certain special cases, as detailed in Table 1 (on the next page).
- 4. *Domestic trade*: This new policy generally does not allow any domestic trade of ivory whether pre-convention or not. Possession and non-commercial domestic transfer are permitted under certain conditions; as detailed in Table 1.
- 5. Parties are requested not to issue pre-convention certificates or permits for export or re-export of elephant ivory to Israel after 1 January 2021, unless the situation is clearly allowed according to the guidelines in Table 1.
- 6. Parties are hereby reminded that Israeli law requires the issuance of an import permit from the Israel Nature and Parks Authority for all wildlife imports (see Notification to the Parties No. 2019/043 of 12 August 2019), whether the specimens are CITES-listed or not.

Table 1. New guidelines for international and domestic trade and possession of ivory in Israel – effective 1 January 2021

Determined according to the date it was removed from the wild or born in captivity: For African elephant (<i>Loxodonta africana</i>) ivory: from before 26 February 1976; For Indian elephant (<i>Elephas maximus</i>) ivory: from before 1 July 1975.
