Additional comments

The following pieces of legislation were not developed specifically for CITES listed species but for the protection, conservation and/or management of local plants and animals some of which happen to be listed on the CITES Appendices. However, much of these environment-related legislation currently in force in Barbados remains dispersed over several statutes charging various Government bodies with the management of the environment.

The Coastal Zone Management Act Cap 394 prohibits the taking and trade of coral species unless given permission by the Minister with responsibility for the Environment. Persons wishing to conduct scientific research using coral samples from Barbados' reefs are required by law to apply for a permit to undertake such research. In addition, the Act also prohibits damage to coral by breaking or through the use of explosives, poisons or other noxious substances, any person who contravenes the law is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine and/or a term of inprisonment.

The Wild Birds Protection Act CAP 398 is an Act that provides for the protection of forty six (46) wild birds (both local and migratory) specified in the schedule, some of which are CITES listed. Any person who knowingly kills or wounds or attempts such an act is liable to a fine, one half of which is payable to the informant. Possession or export of the skin or feathers of any wild bird is also an offence, which is punishable by a fine. The only exception is the killing of wild birds for the purpose of obtaining specimens for natural history provided that a license has been obtained from the Minister responsible for the Environment to do so.

The Animals (Diseases and Importation) Act Cap 253; The draft Animals (National and International Movement and Disease Prevention) Act (which will replace Cap 253);

The Animals (Diseases and Importation Control) Regulations, 1961; The Animals (Diseases and Importation Control) (Amendment) Regulations, 1991 and the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 2000 -16 though not specifically developed for CITES listed species are all pieces of legislation utilised by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development to assist in the maintainenance of good health of the local animal populations (some of which are CITES listed) through the prevention of the introduction of exotic diseases as well as define the duties of Veterinary Officers, specify regulations for the importation of animals and the relevant quarantine protocols.

The draft Zoos Licensing Act in its current form addresses the establishment and regulation of zoos in Barbados.

The Fisheres Act Cap 391 addresses the provision for the management and development of fisheries (including protection of endangered and critically endangered sea turtles from exploitation) in Barbados.

The Fisheries Management Regulations (1998) address closed areas and seasons, fishing methods and equipment to be adopted, and protective measures for lobsters, turtles, sea urchins and tuna.

The Trees (preservation) Act Cap 397 provides for the preservation of any tree species the circumference of which is one or more metres at a point half a metre or more from the ground; but does not apply to the killing of the tree to prevent imminent danger or that is in compliance with an obligation under any other act

The Protection of New Plant Varieties Act (2000-17) is an Act that seeks to provide property rights with respect to flora, and therefore can be used as a tool to regulate and control biodiversity access.
