Please provide details if available: Legislation has not yet been enacted. There are other intiatives that may complement the implementation of CITES, but were not necessarily done specifically for that purpose: For example:

In the year 2000, Saint Lucia submitted a document to the CBD Secretariat entitled: "Intellectual Property and Traditional Knowledge Related to Genetic Resources". The issues raised in this document are to be incorporated into the proposed Biodiversity Act, which will contain provisions that guide access to genetic resources.

It is recognized that new legislation should be enacted under the various articles of the CBD, especially Article 8. This will allow for holders of traditional knowledge to be identified for equitable sharing of benefits derived from the use of this knowledge.

A draft Plant Variety Protection (PVP) Act exists, but additional legislation may be required. This is to ensure that indigenous communities have continued access to genetic resources and traditional knowledge for their use.

A revision process is underway for the Fisheries Act No. 10 of 1984 and the Fisheries Regulations No. 9 of 1994. This legislation contains domestic measures for CITES listed species including queen conch, sea turtles and coral, as well as provisions that deal with import and export of fish.

	Comments (general o date)		
	In late 2001, Saint Lucia initated a process for the preparation of national enabling legislation for CITES. This process has involved multiple agencies and individuals in Saint Lucia, including the office of the Attorney General. Saint Lucia has also received substantial technical support from the CITES Secretariat. In spite of a few set-backs often beyond the control of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (Management		
	Authority), which have been communicated to the Secretariat, there was optimism that the legislation would be finalised by the stipulated deadline of December 31, 2005. In this regard, the final set of comments from the Secretariat and the Management Authority were submitted to Saint Lucia's Legislative Drafting Unit on August 25, 2005. The Management Authority was subsequently informed by the		

aforementioned Unit that a new and improved drafting style is mandated for all new legislation in Saint Lucia, which includes the draft CITES legislation. The first draft was subsequently completed and Saint Lucia now had a newly formatted draft CITES Act and Regulations, which needed to be reviewed. This version was circulated to all parties, including the Secretariat on October 6, 2005, following receipt by the Legislative Drafting Unit. It was substantially different from the format of the previous version and in addition, while the intention of the Drafting Unit was for formatting changes only, content changes had inadvertently been made.

Therefore, Saint Lucia's legislation could not be finalised by the December 31, 2005 deadline. Few comments had been forthcoming from reviewing parties, and the situation was compounded by the fact that both of the officers from the Department of Fisheries who had been coordinating the legislative process were not available, with one of these officers returning to office in March, 2006.

With regards to the foregoing, the Secretariat was written, requesting an eight-month extension following December 31, 2005, that is, up to August 2006. Unfortunately, this deadline was not met due to staffing constraint issues being experienced at the Office of the Attorney General, coupled with political changes and preparations for elections.

The new CITES Act was finally recently prublished in the Saint Lucia Gazette issue of September 17, 2007. A commencement date for enactment should be provided shortly. In the interim, Saint Lucia will continue to work on the CITES Regulations, which contain many of the enabling proviisons (such as fees) for the new Act.
