6		* According to the national law (Nature Conservation Act of 16th April 2004, with further amendments) holders of live animals including amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals of species covered by EU regulations on wildlife trade (CITES species) are obliged to submit written declaration of possession concerning CITES listed species to appropriate district authority, in order to register specimens they keep. Obligation of registration does not apply to Zoological Gardens and persons involved in animal trade, carrying on an economic activity (e.g. owners of pet shops, sellers) as well as persons keeping CITES animals temporarily for the medical treatment and rehabilitation purposes. The abovementioned sellers are obliged however to possess documents stating legal origin of an animal they sell and to pass with that animal, aforementioned documents to the buyer (e.g. copy of CITES import permit, permit for acquisition from nature, and in case of birth in captivity – a document issued by district veterinary service, confirming animal birth in captivity, or other document stating legality of origin). * - Prohibitions referring to harvesting, possessing, transport, sale and purchase apply to all native protected species (including native CITES species). Exemptions from mentioned prohibitions can be granted only by the Minister of the Environment, who issues certain permission.

According to the information reported by the Ministry of Finance, in 2007 Customs Service carried out 230 seizures consisting of 3196 CITES specimens, including: 248 live animals (birds and reptiles), 1585 specimens of Traditional Asian Medicine, 25 plants, 103 kg of caviar, 105 kg of corals (*Scleractinia* spp.), 20 kg of *Leptoptilos crumeniferus* fluff and 4.7 kg of rhino's horns.

In 2008 Customs Service carried out 183 seizures consisting of 200 889 specimens, including: 104 live animals (birds and reptiles), 200 409 specimens of TAM (medicines containing derivatives of *Hippocampus* spp.) and 409 plasters containing derivatives of *Moschus* spp., as well as 27.5 kg of caviar and 65.2 kg of corals (*Scleractinia* spp.).

Annex II - C6, C7, C8, C9

Violations of the CITES provisions (included in national and EU law) result in sanctions such as penalty of detention or fine (for offences) and sentence of imprisonment from 3 months up to 5 years (for crimes).

In accordance with the Nature Conservation Act of 16 April 2004 the following actions are considered as offences:

- not declaring the keeping of live, reptiles, birds and mammals of species covered by EU regulations on wildlife trade (CITES species) to the register,
- not possessing and not providing to the buyer documents referring to legal origin of the animal which is being sold (this obligation applies to sellers and other persons carrying on an economic activity related to wildlife trade).

According to the mentioned Act the following actions, among others, are considered as crimes:

- transporting and border-crossing of CITES specimens without necessary permits,
- not presenting the import notification at the border Customs office (obligation concerns Annex C and D specimens),
- using specimens of CITES species for the purposes different then those indicated in the permit or certificate,
- carrying out commercial activities concerning CITES specimens without appropriate documents stating their legal acquisition (origin) and without fulfilment of conditions provided in CITES related regulations.

The most frequent crime against endangered species of fauna and flora is border-crossing without necessary permits and offering for sale without sufficient documents stating their legal origin.

Sentences in the majority of court cases imposed fines and forfeitures of seized specimens. So far, the most severe penalty of imprisonment (from 3 months up to 5 years) has not been imposed (there were cases where it was applied only in suspension). There were also cases where courts also imposed on the convicts obligation of work for the public purposes.

Furthermore, people who were convicted (penalized) for the infringement of provisions regarding wildlife trade can be refused by CITES Management Authority to obtain a CITES permit within the period of 3 years from the date of conviction (art. 61 p. 7 of Nature Conservation Act of 16 April 2004). There was no such case in the reporting period.

Annex III - D6 Capacity building activities

Enforcement Authorities:

2007

Customs Service organised 4 central trainings for Customs officers, including specialised training course on identification of furs and 20 local trainings on basic CITES issues, directed to 600 Customs officers.

WWF Poland, Ministry of Finance and General Police Headquarters organised 2 workshops aimed at training of CITES coordinators in Customs and Police.

Close co-operation between Customs and Police in the area of CITES enforcement resulted in organisation of 2 trainings for prosecutors on general CITES issues.

CITES coordinators of Customs and Police participated in 2 CITES working group meetings. Customs officers took part in distribution of CITES leaflets among passengers departing from the EU.

2008

Customs organised 3 central trainings for Customs officers including seminar on identification of CITES aquatic species and safety procedures while dealing with live seized animals (mammals, birds and reptiles). On the local level Customs organised 4 basic trainings.

In close cooperation with Police and WWF Poland, Customs co-organised two CITES related workshops on identification of tropical timber and Traditional Asian Medicine.

With the support of Customs Chamber in Warsaw, for the very first time, training schemes for dogs concerning detection of CITES specimens have been elaborated.

CITES coordinators of Customs and Police participated in 1 CITES working group meeting.

Regional Prosecutor's Office in Poznan in co-operation with WWF Poland organised seminar on CITES enforcement aspects for app. 50 prosecutors.

Polish Customs representatives, together with British colleagues took part in the CITES workshop organised in London (HM Revenue & Customs, WWF Poland).

Moreover, in the reporting period, Customs organised numerous meetings, lectures and presentations concerning better understanding of CITES for pupils and students. The estimated number of participants reached 9000.

Representatives of Enforcement Authorities furthermore were informing the public on many aspects of CITES implementation by means of television or radio interviews.

Management Authority and Scientific Authority:

Representatives of Management and Scientific Authority informed the society on relevant CITES matters and provisions by means of telephone hotline, interviews for the press, radio and television.

NGO's

Polish Society for Nature Conservation "Salamandra":

Elaboration and edition of the report "CEETES" reflecting scale of trade in endangered species of wild fauna and flora in shops and in the Internet. It was prepared in co-operation with Slovakia, Romania, Bulgaria, Croatia and Serbia).

Elaboration and edition of leaflets concerning conservation aspects of *Anguilla anguilla* and *Lynx rufus*.

Organisation of 5 trainings for representatives of local authorities responsible for registration of CITES animals and publication of a guidebook for registration purposes.

Elaboration and edition of a guidebook directed to the trade sector on current CITES legislation and conditions of trade in CITES species.

Organisation of an exhibition on CITES in the one of the biggest malls in Poznan.

WWF Poland:

Organisation of 4 workshops for CITES coordinators in Customs and Police on: safety procedures in case of control and seizures of live animals, identification of CITES tropical timber and other flora species (together with UK Customs and Royal Botanic Garden), Traditional Asian Medicine (together with TRAFFIC Europe). All workshops were organised in cooperation with Ministry of Finance and General Police Headquarters.

Organisation of several regional trainings for Police and prosecutors.

Financial aid for CITES coordinators in Customs which resulted in participation in the CITES course organised by the British Customs (HM Revenue & Customs) in London.

Creation of the Internet CITES species database (www.wwf.pl/cites).

Edition of guidebooks for identification of *Brachypelma* spp. and wild cats for the enforcement purposes.

Edition of guidebooks on illegal trade in CITES specimens directed to prosecutors.

Organization of numerous information campaigns and educational events directed to the wide public (e.g. pupils, teachers, tourists, travel agencies). The number of participants of school campaigns reached 5000 pupils and 60 teachers.

Distribution of leaflets, booklets, badges, posters at the airports (in cooperation with Polish Airlines LOT, travel agencies and Customs Chambers).

Creation of the exhibition on CITES directed to children. The exhibition was exchanged between the schools around Warsaw.

Schools were provided also with leaflets and CDs on CITES issues.

Moreover, WWF Poland sponsored the purchase of specialised equipment for temporary keeping and transport of seized animals. The equipment was distributed among the major entry border points in Poland.

WWF Poland supports organisation of meetings of the CITES Working Group.

Regional Environmental Center (REC Poland):

In the reporting period REC organised several workshops on enforcement referring to nature protection issues, including CITES matters, directed to the prosecutors and judges. The subject was also supported by several press releases.
