Detailed Information about Seizures and Confiscations of CITES Listed Specimens and Administrative Penalties Year 2011/2012

During reporting period Latvian enforcement authorities (Customs, Nature Conservation Agency and Police) did 42 seizures that resulted in 34 administrative violation cases with confiscations. Totally there have been confiscated 303 products and derivates from CITES listed species and 120 live CITES listed animals (90 of them are medical leeches). 8 seizures were false and seized specimens after expertise were returned to owners. The information about amount and country of origin of confiscated specimens are summarized in table below. The three most significant cases are bolded (please note that there are confiscated several specimens during one administrative violation case).

The total amount of administrative fines for illegally traded CITES specimens for reporting period were 1680 Ls (2400 Euro).

The lowest administrative fine was 50 Ls (~71 Euro), the highest -100 Ls (~140 Euro). In all cases illegally traded specimens have been confiscated.
