

11	Please provide details of any additional measures taken Bulgarian and Romanian enforcement and management authorities work together with representatives from non-governmental organizations and in particular the organization "WWF" on the Life + project "Joint actions to raise awareness on overexploitation of Danube sturgeons in Romania and Bulgaria" which aim is to tackle overfishing, the main direct threat to the survival of Danube sturgeons. The project is from July 2012 until September 2015. Its target groups are fishing communities, law enforcement agencies, decision makers, sturgeon breeders, caviar processors and traders in Romania and Bulgaria. The project is in line with the Action Plan for Conservation of the Sturgeons in the Danube river basin, adopted by the Council of Europe is 2005. Four seminars have been organized – two in 2013 and two in 2014, with the participation of representatives of law enforcement authorities and NGOs. Furthermore, in February 2014 in Sofia a two days workshop and training have been organized on the protection of Danube sturgeons and methods of halting the illegal trade in caviar from wild sturgeon. Over 80 experts from the Bulgarian and international enforcement authorities in Hungary, the Netherlands, Great Britain, Romania, Serbia, Turkey, Austria joined the two-day event in Sofia. In April 2014 experts from National Customs Agency participated in the Second Meeting of the
	Steering Group of the Life+ project "Joint actions to raise awareness on overexploitation of Danube Sturgeon in Romania and Bulgaria" in Bucharest, Romania.
	Another example which brings better understanding of the Convention's requirements is related to a Guide prepared by the Bulgarian Society for the Protection of birds – "Prevention of trafficking in protected species". It is within the scope of the projects "Conservation of Imperal eagle and Saker Falcon in key Natura 2000 sites in Bulgaria" and "Urgent measures to secure the survival of the Egyptian vulture (<i>Neophron percnopterus</i>) in Bulgaria and Greece", both funded under Life + Project of the European Union.
	The Guide is specifically designated to facilitate and support the daily work of the Bulgarian customs officers and border veterinarians in their work on the prevention of illicit trafficking and trade in protected species, especially - birds of prey.

C5 During the period the following specimens were seized:

- a) 580 specimens of Cattleya Hybrid and Phalaenopsis Hybrid (Orhids) seized at Port Burgas on
 21.06.2013 because of the lack of CITES permits. The specimens were not properly packed in order to use the exception for hybrids;
- b) 2 items LPL made from *Crocodylus niloticus* and 1 item LPL made from *Python sebae* were seized on 10.12.2013 at Sofia Airport in personal luggage;
- c) 196 items LPS made from *Crocodylus siamensis* seized at Sofia Airport on 17.04.2014 at Sofia airport. No import permits were presented;
- d) 24 specimens of Scleractinia spp. (Porites, Acropora, Montastrea), 7 specimens of Scleractinia spp. (*Montastrea, Leptoria, Platygira*) and 5 specimens of *Pocillopora damicornis* and *Acropora* spp. seized at Sofia Airport on 06.04.2014, 07.05.2014 and 21.05.2014. All the specimens were found in personal luggage and were confiscated;
- e) 30 live parrots of *Psittacus erithacus* had been seized on 14.09.2014 in the area of Danube Bridge 2 (Vidin) in a vehicle of a Bulgarian, traveling to the Czech Republic. Fake Dutch certificate was presented;
- f) 599 live tortoises of the species *Trachemys scripta elegans* (Not –CITES/ Ann. B to EU WLTR) were seized on 18.11.2014 at Sofia Airport. The specimens were found in a shipment with live aquarium fishes. Not declared. Confiscated because the introduction for this kind of specimens the introduction into the EU is forbidden according to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 888/2014 of 14 august 2014;
- g) 17 items LPS made from *Python sebae* and *Varanus niloticus* were seized on 07.10.2014 at Sofia Airport in personal luggage. No CITES permits were presented;
- h) 15 specimens of row corals Scleractinia spp. were seized on 13.11.2014 and another 2 specimens had been seized on 27.11.2014 at Sofia Airport in personal luggage of two travelers. No CITES permits were presented.
- i) 1 live parrot of *Psittacus erithacus* was seized on 1.12.2014 and confiscated by the Regional Inspectorate of Environment and Water in Pleven. No documents for legal acquisition were presented.
- j) 30 tins of caviar seized in Serbia. No- CITES document for export was presented to the Serbian CITES Authority. This seizure was communicated via EU-TWIX. Bulgarian CITES MA contacted for more information the Serbian CITES Authority and together with the Bulgarian Customs Authority has investigated the case. It was found that the export took place on 04.12.2013. An administrative sanction was imposed to the exporter – a Bulgarian company, by the Regional Inspectorate of Environment and Water of Varna, Bulgaria.
