CITES-sopimus sääntelee luonnonvaraisten uhanalaisten eläin- ja kasvilajien kansainvälistä kauppaa

Uhanalaisilla eläin- ja kasvilajeilla ei saa käydä kauppaa rajoituksetta. CITES-sopimus (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Flora and Fauna) suojelee luonnonvaraisia lajeja kansainvälisen kaupan haitallisilta seurauksilta.

CITES-yleissopimus on yksi maailman laajimmista ympäristönsuojelusopimuksista. Se suojelee yli 35 600 uhanalaista eläin- ja kasvilajia sääntelemällä eläinten ja kasvien, niiden osien ja niistä valmistettujen tuotteiden kansainvälistä kauppaa.

Sopimuksen alaiset lajit ovat uhanalaistuneet tai vaarassa uhanalaistua niillä käytävän kansainvälisen kaupan seurauksena. Lajit on luokiteltu ns. lajiliitteisiin todetun suojelutarpeen mukaan. CITESin lajiliitteessä I luetellaan lajit, joilla kaupankäynti on kokonaan kielletty, ja lajiliitteessä II lajit, jotka ovat vaarassa uhanalaistua, ellei kauppaa säännellä.

Sopimus koskee kansainvälistä kauppaa, eli valtion ulkorajat ylittävää sekä kaupallista että ei-kaupallista tuontia ja vientiä. Myös tarhattujen CITES-eläinten ja viljeltyjen CITES-kasvien tuonti- ja vienti on luvanvaraista.

Tulli tarkastaa luvat ja todistukset

Sopimuksen tarkoitus on turvata uhanalaisia lajeja ja estää lajien uhanalaistuminen. Se ei kuitenkaan tarkoita täyskieltoa. Sopimuksen lajeista noin 2,5 prosenttia on sellaisia, joiden luonnonvaraisia yksilöitä ei voi tuoda tai viedä kaupallisesti.

Kauppaa säännellään pääasiassa eriasteisin tuonti- ja vientirajoituksin, ja lupamenettely riippuu kyseisen lajin uhanalaisuusluokasta. Käytännössä kauppaa valvotaan maiden ympäristöviranomaisten myöntämillä, tullissa esitettävillä kirjallisilla CITESluvilla ja -todistuksilla.

CITES-sopimus

- koskee noin 5 600 uhanalaista eläinlajia ja yli 30 000 uhanalaista kasvilajia
- astui voimaan vuonna 1975, Suomessa vuonna 1976
- sopimuksen on allekirjoittanut 180 maata

Euroopan unionissa yhteinen CITES-lainsäädäntö

Sopimus on toimeenpantu EU:ssa unionin yhteisellä CITESlainsäädännöllä, jossa lajit on lueteltu liitteissä A ja B.

EU:n ulkopuoliset CITESin osapuolimaat toimeenpanevat sopimusta omalla lainsäädännöllään. Eläinten ja kasvien tuonnissa, viennissä ja muussa toiminnassa on noudatettava sekä tuonti- että vientimaan CITES-vaatimuksia muuta lain-

säädäntöä unohtamatta.

EU:n rajat ylittävän tuonnin ja viennin lisäksi unionin lainsäädäntö sääntelee myös yhteisön sisäistä uhanalaisten lajien kauppaa; sekä maiden välistä että sisäistä. Esimerkiksi A-liitteen lajeille vaaditaan erillinen EU-todistus ostoon, myyntiin ja muuhun kaupalliseen toimintaan.

Matkustatko EU:ssa, ylitätkö EU:n ulkorajan? Aiotko tuoda matkoiltasi eksoottisia tuliaisia, koriste-esineitä, nahkatuotteita, luontaistuotteita, elintarvikkeita, kasveja tai eläimiä tai niistä valmistettuja tuotteita?

Tutustu CITES-lainsäädäntöön välttääksesi uhanalaisilla lajeilla käytävää laitonta kauppaa. Lainsäädännön rikkominen voi johtaa tuliaistesi takavarikointiin tullissa, sakkoihin tai

vakavimmissa tapauksissa jopa syytteeseen.

Selvitä laji ja sen mahdollinen luvanvaraisuus ennen ostoa ja tuontia, ja hanki luvat ajoissa. Lupia ei myönnetä jälkikäteen. Ellet varmuudella tiedä onko kyseessä luvanvarainen kasvi, eläin tai sellaisesta valmistettu tuote, jätä kaupat tekemättä.

Huomioi, että osia ja johdannaisia uhanalaisista lajeista saattaa olla monissa tuotteissa, kuten koruissa ja koriste-esineissä, vaatteissa, soittimissa, kosmetiikassa, luontaistuotteissa ja elintarvikkeissa.

Eläimet: karhut, susi, kissaeläimet, saukot, apinaeläimet, valaat, ankerias, sampikalat, kivikorallit, norsut, sarvikuonot ja useat muut "safarieläimet", krokotiilieläimet, papukaijat, kolibrit, petolinnut ja pöllöt. Lisäksi mm. monet käärmeet, liskot, kilpikonnat, sammakkoeläimet, hämähäkit, perhoset, haikalat, rauskut, simpukat ja kotilot.

Kasveja: kämmekkäkasvit eli orkideat, kaktukset, aloet, mehityräkit, lumikellot, ginseng, käpypalmut ja raminipuut. Lisäksi mm. jotkin mahongit ja palisanterit.

Eläinten ja kasvien osia: nahat, karvat, luut, kuoret, sarvet ja syöksyhampaat, höyhenet ja sulat, juuret ja lehdet, munat, liha, veri, ja myski.

Tuotteita, jotka saattavat sisältää CITES-lajeja: soittimet, käsilaukut, turkit, vyöt, kengät, vaatteet, kellonrannekkeet, perhot, veistokset, lääkkeet ja rohdot, kosmetiikka, hajuvedet, suitsukkeet, puu- ja sahatavara sekä liha- ja kalavalmisteet, mm. kaviaari.

SÄÄDÖKSET

- Uhanalaisten eläinten ja kasvien kansainvälistä kauppaa sääntelevä CITES-yleissopimus 1.7.1975
- EU:n asetukset 1.6.1997 lähtien
- Sääntelyn piirissä on noin 30 000 kasvilajia, mm. kaikki orkideat. Suuri osa on uhanalaisia. Osaa säännellään yhdennäköisyyden vuoksi. Sääntely koskee eläviä ja kuolleita yksilöitä, niiden osia ja orkideaa sisältäviä tuotteita.

LAJILIITTEET


- A (I) uhanalaiset, kaupankäynti on kielletty
- B (II) vaarassa uhanalaistua ellei kauppaa säännellä lupamenettelyllä

SÄÄNTELY

- A- ja B -liitteiden elävien kasvien tuonti EU:n ulkopuolelta edellyttää yksityishenkilöiltäkin lähtömaan vientiluvan ja Suomen ympäristökeskuksen myöntämän tuontiluvan. Saavuttaessa on voimassaolevat luvat esitettävä tullissa.
 - Lupia ei myönnetä takautuvasti.
- Vienti EU:n ulkopuolelle edellyttää pääsääntöisesti vientiluvan esittämistä.
- EU:n alueella lupia ei yleensä tarvita, mutta orkideaostosten kuitti tai todiste yksilön alkuperästä on syytä säilyttää.

POIKKEUKSET SÄÄNTELYSTÄ

- Ei koske siemeniä, kudosviljelmiä, viljeltyjen kasvien leikkokukkia tai vaniljaa
- Tuotaessa A-liitteen viljeltyjä kasveja, niitä kohdellaan kuten B-liitteen lajeja
- Tietyt maat voivat käyttää terveystodistusta viljeltyjen kasvien vientilupana
- Henkilökohtaisten esineiden lievempi sääntely ei koske eläviä kasveja
