

ANNEX - PROPOSED BIENNIAL REPORT FORMAT

Administrative measures been imposed for CITES – related violations (reported by NEG – National Environmental Guard)

- 1. Illegal possession of two species of *Caiman crocodilus* imported from the Czech Republic, designated for trading. It was applied two fines value approximately 8900 EUR.
- 2. Illegal possession of two species of *Testudo graeca* from Marocco, found in the luggage by a tourist in airport. It was applied fine value approximately 1700 EUR and the specimens were confiscated.

Type of violations

1. Illegal possession of four specimens of *Panthera leo* was investigated as a result of targeting received by NEG. The investigation was carried out by enforcement authorities to a private person.

On the date of control, the person declared that specimens were surrendered by the proper owner but doesn't what to reveal his identity.

The enforcement authorities started the prosecution proceeding. The investigation is ongoing.

- 2. Illegal possession of one specimens of *Falco tinnunculus*.
